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Defining Health Disparity

- Health disparity is the same thing as health inequality.
- A health disparity or inequality exists when there is difference or in the presence of disease, a health outcome or access to health care between population groups (age, gender identity, ethnic, racial, etc. groups).





Infant Mortality Rate in Travis County, 1999-2014 African American, Hispanic & White 3 Year Averages



How CommUnityCare Uses Data to Inform its Services


Performs a Comprehensive Community Health Needs Assessment that looks at differences/disparities in:


- Prevention Quality (Indicators, Ambulatory Care, Sensitive Conditions)
- Vital Statistics (Population, Births, Deaths)
- Access (Health Insurance, Geography)
- Demographics (Socioeconomic Status)
- Clinical Indicators (Co-morbidity i.e. obesity and diabetes)
- Available Resource (Food Deserts, Free/Reduced Lunches, Housing)












Medical Outcomes in Austin




Clinical Preventive Services – Women 65 and Over

Mammography Use - Women 50 - 74















Why Perform a CHNA? Looking For Indicators of Health Inequity
