 In 2018, 183,985 people received health care services as a direct result of Central Health funding














Measuring Progress: Primary Care










Federally Funded Health Coverage

MAP Eligibility



- Uninsured Travis County resident
- Ineligible for Medicaid, CHIP, Medicare, or the Health Insurance Marketplace
- Meet Federal Poverty Level (FPL) income guidelines
 - Elderly and disabled- 200% FPL
 - Citizens and Legal Permanent residents- 100% FPL
 - Non-citizens/Non-Legal Permanent Residents- 50% FPL
 - 100% FPL if diagnosed with 2 or more chronic conditions
- 6 Month Enrollment Period













MAP BASIC Eligibility



- Uninsured Travis County resident
- Meet Federal Poverty Level (FPL) income guidelines regardless of US residency
 - 200% and below
- They may be eligible for but not enrolled in Medicaid, CHIP, Medicare Part B, or Commercial Insurance
- 12 month enrollment period















MAP Benefits and Copays

- Primary care-\$10
- Dental care-\$10
- Specialty care-\$10
- Urgent/Convenient care visits-\$10
- Prescriptions-\$7/10

- Inpatient hospital care at any Travis County Seton Hospital-\$30
- Emergency room visits at a Seton-\$25
- EMS, Home Health Services, X-Rays, and Lab services-\$0











MAP BASIC Benefits



- Primary care services offered at the clinic
 - OB and pregnancy visits are not covered
- Prescriptions
 - Covers prescriptions written by CommUnityCare, Lone Star Circle of Care, and People's Community Clinic
- Dental and Specialty Care for CommUnityCare patients











MAP BASIC Copays

101-150%	BASIC 150	\$15	\$8 / \$6

176-200%	BASIC 200	\$30	\$10 / \$8
