Different From the Start

- **Built at UT Austin**
 - The first med school in nearly 50 years built at an AAU/Association of American Universities member school
- **Unprecedented partnership with our community**
 - 2012 Proposition 1 vote; \$35 million annual investment by Travis County taxpayers
- **Opportunity to start from scratch**
 - Groundbreaking curriculum, no bad habits or reliance on old ways of doing things

Vision

A vital, inclusive health ecosystem

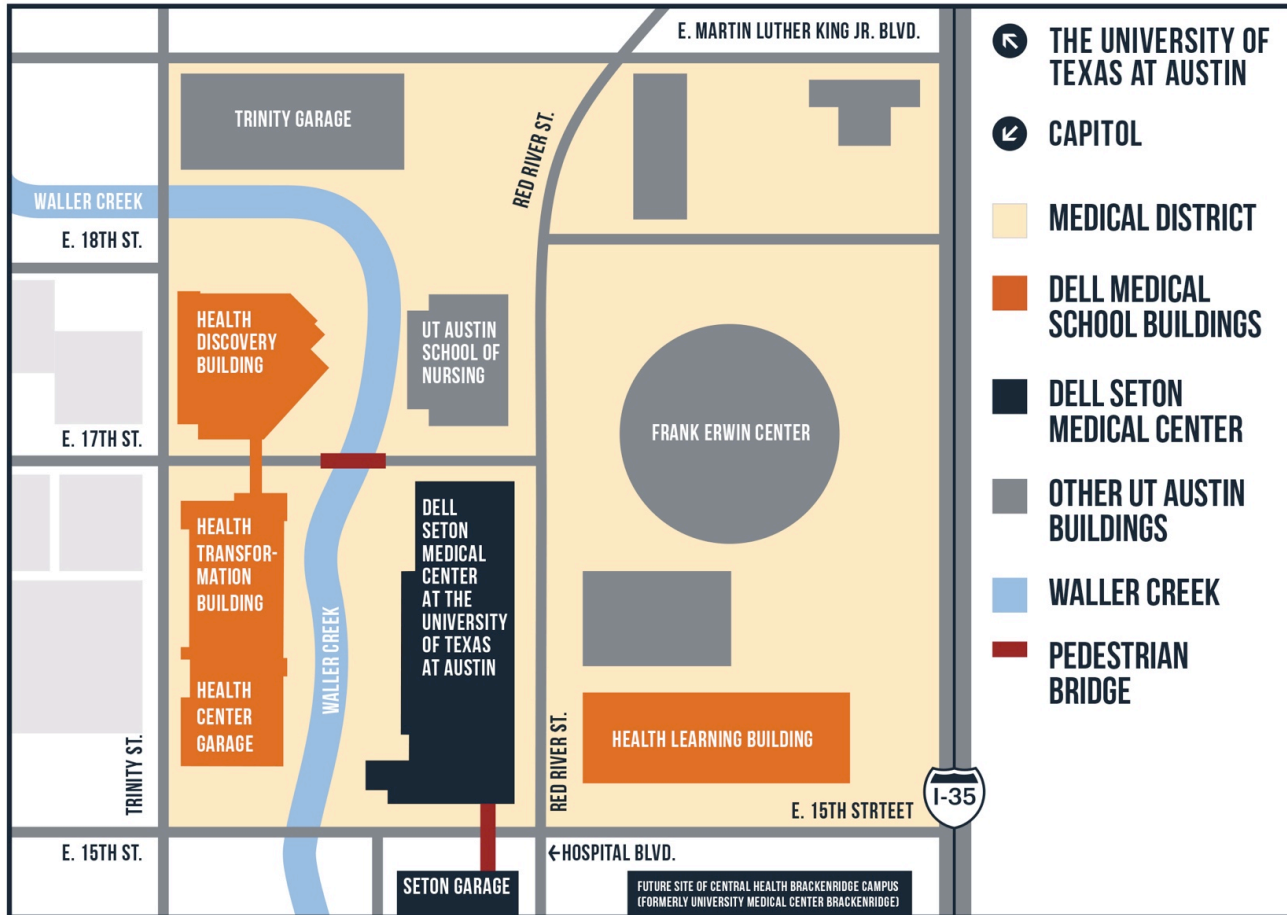
- *Vital:* Vigorous, animated, full of life and energy, dynamic
- *Inclusive:* Open to everyone
- *Ecosystem:* The complex of a community and its environment functioning as a system

Mission

Revolutionize how people get and stay healthy by:

- ***Improving health in our community*** as a model for the nation;
- ***Evolving new models*** of person-centered, multidisciplinary care that reward value;
- ***Accelerating innovation and research*** to improve health;
- ***Educating leaders*** who transform health care; and
- ***Redesigning the academic health environment*** to better serve society.

Health District



Dell Seton Medical Center at The University of Texas

- Teaching hospital owned and operated by Seton (not Dell Med)
- \$310 million investment
- 211 beds
- Replaced UMC-Brackenridge as region's safety-net hospital
- Opened May 2017

Educating Future Physicians

- 50 students each year
- June 2017: Arrival of first class (4,500+ applicants)
- First graduation is May of 2020
- Third class started this summer
 - 64% women and 20% from race/ethnicity underrepresented in medicine

Curriculum: Rethinking Education

- Interprofessional from day one
- Accelerated: Clinical work in second year
- Interprofessional
- Design Thinking
- Leadership
- Differentiated third year

- Founding partners:

 - Seton Ascension
- Integral Care
- Huston-Tillotson University
- Local ISDs: Health Sciences Summer Camps
- Others across the community

UT Health Austin

- Launched October 2017 in Dell Med's Health Transformation building
- In first 7 months
 - 2,689 unique patients served
 - 3,066 visits paid for by MAP, Medicaid & Medicare
- Today, 7 clinics open

Delivering on Our Promise

- **More doctors**
 - 284 medical residents providing care (est. 300+ by 2020)
- **Shorter wait times**
 - Eliminated waiting list for specialty orthopedic care
- **Better health for women**
 - Redesigned the care model for prenatal and post-partum care
- **Integrated mental and behavioral health care**
 - Making it part of primary and specialty care

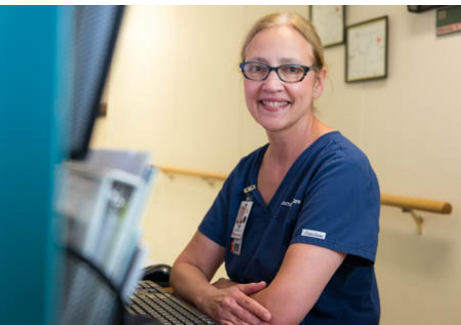
