<u>Transformation vs. Innovation</u>



Dr. Mark Hernandez, Chief Medical Officer, Community Care Collaborative

Dr. Hernandez works with multiple clinicians and service organizations throughout Travis County to fulfill the goals of the Collaborative, which include transforming the delivery of care into an integrated system. Dr. Hernandez started in health care in 1993, when he was licensed as a registered nurse and worked for the Harris County Hospital District and Ben Taub General Hospital in Houston as an intensive care nurse for 10 years. Dr. Hernandez, who graduated from Baylor College of Medicine in 2003, did his residency in internal medicine at University Medical Center Brackenridge and, upon graduation, served as chief resident. He entered general internal medicine practice with Scott & White Clinic in Pflugerville before returning to Seton in 2008 as an academic hospitalist at University Medical Center Brackenridge. In 2011, he became their medical director. One year later, he was promoted to his current position, adding the hospital ambulatory clinics, including the Shivers Cancer Center and Infusion Suite, an internal medicine primary care clinic, numerous sub-specialty clinics and Seton Total Health Partners, a population health program to serve the needs of chronically ill under and uninsured patients in Travis County to his list of responsibilities. Dr. Hernandez is board-certified in internal medicine. He holds academic appointments with the University of Texas Southwestern University and the University of Texas Medical Branch, is adjunct faculty with the University of Texas at Austin School of Nursing and active in advanced practice nursing student education.

Since then, he has spent time practicing in Boise, Idaho and Houston, Texas. In this role, he supervised and taught chiropractic interns in day-to-day clinical activities. In 2013, Devin graduated from Samford University with a master's in nursing and became board certified as a family nurse practitioner.

<u>Virtual Care and Telemedicine</u>



Kristi Henderson, Vice President of Innovation and Virtual Care, Ascension's Texas Ministry

Dr. Kristi Henderson is the Vice President for Virtual Care & Innovation at Seton Healthcare, which is part of Ascension, the largest non-profit health system in the country. She is also a clinical professor in Population Health in the Dell Medical School at UT-Austin. Prior to this role, she was the Chief Telehealth & Innovation Officer for the University of Mississippi Medical Center, where she led the development of a statewide telehealth program, which is recognized as a national model. A few of her accomplishments include: 2017, American Academy of Nurse Practitioners State Award for excellence, 2015 Mississippi's 50 Leading Business Women, 2013 Robert Wood Johnson Nurse Executive Fellow, the 2014 Nurse Innovator of the Year, 2012 Advanced Practice Nurse of the Year, and voted an "Edge Runner" by the American Academy of Nurses.

She has testified before two U.S. Senate Committees and the White House Domestic Policy Council to advance nursing and telehealth. She has made numerous presentations across the country to advance new models of care, including giving a TEDx talk and speaking at the 2016 & upcoming 2017 SXSW event in Austin.

She currently serves on the executive board for the American Telemedicine Association and on the National Quality Forum telehealth committee. She represents the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners on the National Council of State Legislators telemedicine task force and serves as a member of the National Governor's Association telemedicine committee. She has also served as a telehealth advisor to the Association of American Medical Colleges.

Dr. Henderson received her doctorate of nursing practice from the University of Alabama at Birmingham; her master's in nursing from the Mississippi University for Women; and her bachelor's in nursing from Mississippi College. She maintains national certification as a family and acute care nurse practitioner and is a fellow in the Emergency Nurses Association.
