#### **Dr. Alan Schalscha, Chief Medical Officer, CommUnityCare Health Centers**

Dr. Schalscha serves as the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) for CommUnityCare Health Centers. In addition to CMO, Dr. Schalscha is also an affiliate clinical associate professor at The University of Texas Dell Medical School and helps integrate health care into clinical education. He graduated from the University of Texas with two bachelor's degrees and master's degree prior to entering medical school. He received his medical degree from Midwestern University and completed his residency in Family Medicine. For the past 16 years Dr. Schalscha has volunteered as a board member of DOCARE International, an international humanitarian organization that sponsors numerous medical missions annually.
