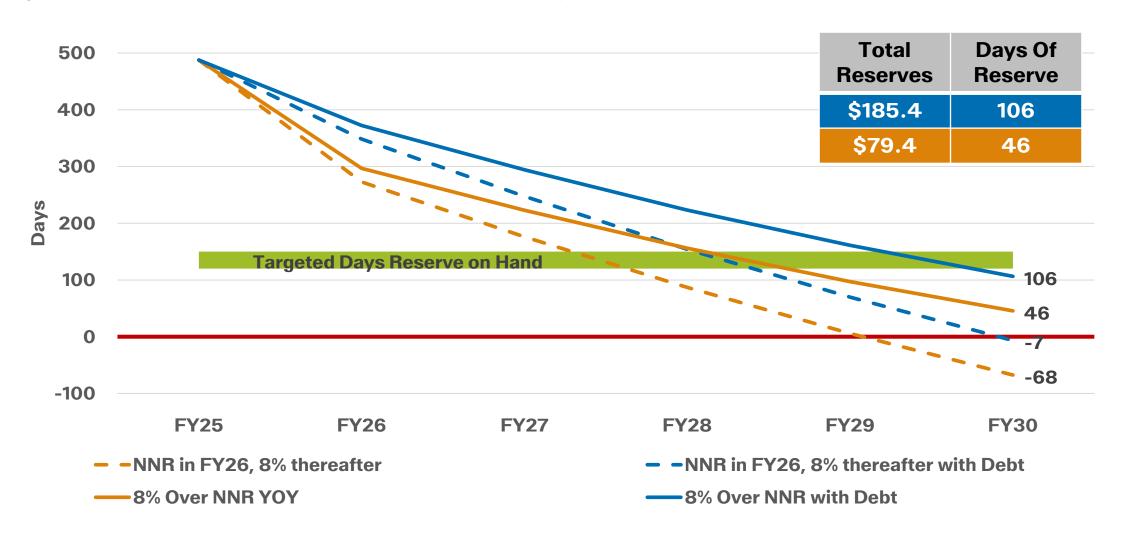

Impact of FY26 No New Revenue Rate

- Reduces FY26 Property Tax revenue by \$33.4M
- Reduces reserve levels by \$197M over 5-year forecast period at 8% YOY
- Future impacts will include some or all the following:
 - Reduced depth and/or breadth of service levels
 - Less access, longer wait times
 - Increase hospital non-emergent care in emergency room
 - More cost to overall local health system
 - Deterioration of overall health of safety net population
 - Future eligibility criteria that limits covered population
 - Less financial flexibility and capacity to mitigate risks

New Proposed Reserve Policy

Objective

- Establish new Public Health Center Reserve to help mitigate risk by maintaining adequate cash reserves
 - Initial Funding of \$12 Million in Central Health
 - Mirrors amount established by CommUnityCare Board
 - Total aggregate of \$24M represents a minimum of 30 days cash on hand
 - Will need to re-evaluate amount on an annual basis to maintain an aggregate target of 30 days cash on hand
 - Repayment plan required for use of Central Health funds

Proposed Public Health Center Cash Reserve Policy

Central Health shall establish a Public Health Center Reserve (PHCR) to serve as a source of emergency cash funding in the event of an unforeseen event within the HRSA-approved Public Health Center. The initial amount to be established in the Central Health FY26 approved budget is \$12 million.

Use of the Central Health designated reserve funds must be approved or ratified by the Central Health Board of Managers. In addition, a repayment plan must be presented to the Board within forty-five (45) days of any such use.

On an annual basis, the reserve funding amount shall be reviewed and may be adjusted to ensure that the aggregate level of cash on hand is equivalent to at least thirty (30) days of cash on hand based on CommUnityCare financial information.

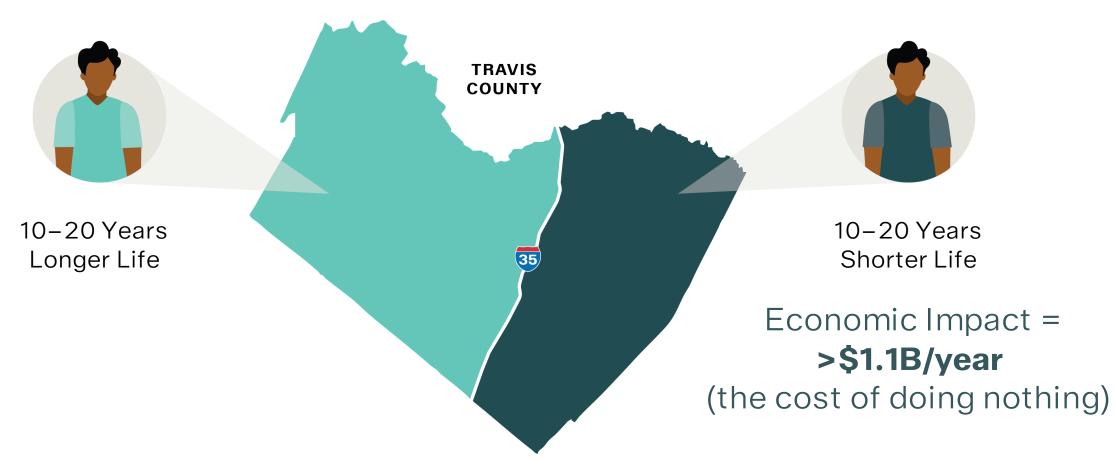

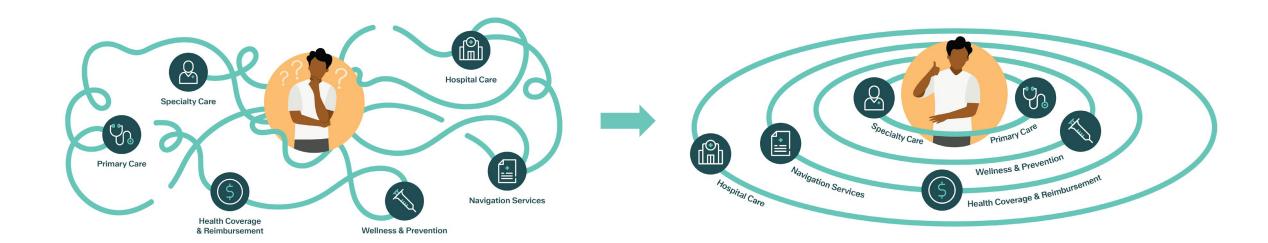
